

Five million dollars' worth of raw silk arrived in Seattle on the Steamship Kaga Maru from the Orient on Friday at 7:00 a. m. At 4:30 p. m. Great Northern Engine 2517 hauled the silk out of Seattle in a nineteen-car train, arriving at St. Paul Sunday night at 11:05, distance 1,789 miles, running time fifty-two hours and thirty-five minutes.

At 9:05 the next morning, the same Engine 2517 hauling Great Northern mail train 27, the fastest long distance train in the world, left St. Paul for Seattle and made the through run in 47 hours and 10 minutes, completing a round trip of 3,578 miles in 99 hours and 45 minutes running time between terminals, including stops for fuel and water, having twice crossed two mountain ranges—a record run for a single locomotive.

Devils Lake is one of the fastest growing cities of North Dakota and the chief marketing center of the Lake Region of North Dakota. It is a modern city with splendid stores and hotels, paved streets and high class municipal improvements. It is situated on the north shore of the lake from which it derives its name. This interesting body of water is about thirty miles long and varies in width from three to fifteen miles. It is a salt water lake having its source in saline springs. It owes its name to the superstitious Sioux who called it "Minnewaukon" or "Evil Water."

On the south shore of the lake is Fort Totten Indian Reservation and Sully's Hill National Park established to commemorate General Sully's victory. The lake is surrounded by the mounds of ancient mound builders. Most of the contents of these mounds now rest in various museums and Universities throughout the country, the contents being principally pottery and ancient instruments of warfare.

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

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Junior Live Stock Special Train

At the close of the Eighth Annual Junior Live Stock Show at South St. Paul, the Great Northern Railway provided a special train to make a six-day tour in Minnesota and North Dakota, carrying 16 of the boys and girls with their prize-winning animals.

The children ranged in age from 10 to 18 years.

The trip covered 1,234 miles, going as far west as Minot, N. D., by way of Pipestone, and returning by way of Grand Forks and Crookston. Twenty-two stops were made at the principal points enroute ranging from one to four hours each.

At each stop there was a parade and exhibition of the animals, and the boys and girls made a short talk in which they told of their experience in raising the animals. Large crowds of from 500 to 3,000 school children, farmers and their families, and busi ness men gathered to greet them. Although they wer required to repeat the performance from three to five times each day they carried out their part of the program with the greatest enthusiasm and interest.

Each community had arranged a special program that included addresses of welcome by mayors or other prominent local persons, and where time permitted banquets were tendered to all the members of the party. At several places valuable souvenirs and presents were given to the Junior prize winners.

The far-reaching educational benefits of the tour are indicated by the large amount of interest that was shown by each community. At several of the places where the train stopped, from 1,500 to 3,000 persons attended the exercises and saw the exhibition.

Several adjoining counties sent delegates from boys' and girls' clubs, club leaders and business men. At Benson delegates came from as far as Ortonville, at New Rockford 50 delegates came from Jamestown

and more than 75 miles beyond, and at Minot delegates came from McKenzie County, almost 100 miles distant.

The tour developed into one of the greatest events that has ever occurred to stimulate interest in live stock growing by showing concrete evidence of the possibilities of producing profitable animals on farms of the Northwest, by using well-bred animals and good methods of care and feeding.

The train consisted of a baggage car, Palace stock car, Standard sleeping car, dining car and compartment observation car. The Great Northern Railway provided all equpiment and all service, including transportation, sleeping car accommodations and meals, without charge, as a contribution to agricultural education.

The tour was in charge of E. C. Leedy, General Agricultural Development Agent, Great Northern Railway, and was conducted with the co-operation of the Extension Departments of the University of Minnesota and North Dakota Agricultural College. T. A. Erickson and H. E. Rilling, Supervisors of the Boys' and Girls' Club Work, also with the co-operation of the several firms who purchased the animals at the close of the Junior Live Stock Show.

Each year the Great Northern Railway has contributed financially to the support of the Junior Live Stock Show, and assisted in rewarding the individual winners by the purchase of animals at the auction, which is the closing event of the show.

This year five of the county prize-winning steers were purchased, from which delicious baby beef steaks and roasts will be served on Great Northern dining

Montana. The factory has just been completed 1,000 tons of beets, which would make about 2,500 res of sugar beets grown by E. D. Tuck at Harlem,

HE year 1925 marks the beginning of beet sugar manufacturing along the Great Northern Railway in Northern Montana.

The success which has attended the early experiments in widely scattered regions has prompted sugar manufacturers to approve the expenditure of several million dollars for new sugar factories in our territory.

In the Milk River Valley about 5.500 acres of beets are being grown between Glasgow and Chinook. On other irrigated projects tributary to Great Falls 1,200 acres are being grown for shipment to the Chinook factory.

At Sidney, Montana, on the Lower Yellowstone irrigation project the Holly Sugar Company is erecting a refinery to cost \$1,250,000, with daily capacity of 1,200 tons of beets. 8,000 acres are in beets.

In the Puget Sound region of Washington, at Bellingham, the Utah-Idaho Sugar Company are erecting a factory with capacity of 1,000 tons per day. More than 4,000 acres are in sugar beets this year.

Ultimately the Northwest can, and probably will, raise all of the sugar it will require for consumption at home and have some to spare for shipment elsewhere.
